The interview was conducted by Roland Tüscher and Béla Szoradi at the Goetheanum in Dornach on May 23, 2023.

1) Roland Tüscher: I would like to remind you again of this one sentence of yours from the General Assembly of the General Anthroposophical Society 2022, where I did indeed link to it in our correspondence and subsequently in 'Ein Nachrichtenblatt'. I will read it out now:

"But we're also seeing new interest and growing enthusiasm for the possibilities our medicine offers, in line with a new movement for planetary health and One Health."

So, the question for me now is, you have said that and we have corresponded a lot: Do you want to say anything about that?

Georg Soldner: I can actually say a lot about this. Personally, for me the topic itself starts very early, because in 1999 the actually highest-ranking publication from anthroposophic medicine so far, together with a very prestigious Swedish institute, on the subject of allergy development in children appeared in the journal *The Lancet* - which is one of the three leading journals in the world in medicine - which proved for the first time that allergy development in children (neurodermatitis, asthma) is related to the lifestyle of the family. Until then, in medicine (neurodermatitis, asthma) it was considered: this is genetic. Although one actually already knew that it can't be true at all, because for example in East and West Germany there were very different allergy rates and the genetics was actually the same. And then it turned out that this was especially different in anthroposophical families or what is called "anthroposophical lifestyle" - although individual elements can have an allergy-protective effect even without an anthroposophical lifestyle, for example the proximity, already in pregnancy and in early childhood, to animals.
