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"The great resistance of the time" in the face of all humanistic observation - II.

Part I. tried to show how the currently still accepted concept of unconnected individual sciences has a destructive effect on man and the environment, since it does not gain its insights from an orientation towards the world wholeness. According to Rudolf Steiner, the task of the anthroposophical society is to overcome this concept by means of the overall view presented by him, or to expand it, to combine the partial scientific findings into a totality that is effective for civilization. Then their practical application, instead of producing collateral damage, will have a constructive effect in the whole of nature and man. -

On September 19, 2023, my letter¹, which is followed here by a second part, went to the Executive Council and Goetheanum leadership, - on September 29, 2023, they published their research project at the Michaelmas Conference at the Goetheanum in a brochure: 'Insights'. Both contributions, letter and 'Insights', introduce their reflections using the same quotation from Rudolf Steiner, but render it differently. In the introduction to 'Insights' Christiane Haid, Vesna Forštnerić Lesjak, Matthias Rang, Oliver Conradt and Jean-Michel Florin write:

"We are approaching the one hundredth anniversary of the founding of the School of Spiritual Science. At the 1923/24 Christmas Conference, Rudolf Steiner drew attention to the importance of research from anthroposophical impulses. He spoke of how if he had 50 to 75 million francs at his disposal, he could accomplish in five to ten years with research emanating from the Goetheanum what would otherwise take 50 to 75 years. Steiner mentioned that however isolated and specialized such research results might be, they could combine into a whole and become effective as an impulse in social life."²
